June 16 & 17, 2022 New London Church, Forest Virgina Meeting Minutes

Thursday, June 16, 2022

The Executive Board of the VAFWB State Association met at 8am to discuss reports and proceedings over the next two days.

Thursday Morning

Opening Session of prayer was presided over by Moderator Glenn Johnson.

Dr. Bruce Barnes, Director of the State Promotional Office, took to the podium to open a time for reporting from our National Ministries and representatives present. Those reports included:

- > WNAC, presented by Dr. Eddie Moody
- > International Missions, presented by Don Matchett

Following these reports a closing prayer was offered and a brief intermission took place before the next scheduled session.

Upon reconvening the meeting, the *Rejoice* ensemble, from Welch College provided a time of worship and introduction. They are currently on an 8 week tour through various states and are chaperoned by Dustin Walters, Welch Divinity School Recruiter and Connections Pastor at Rejoice Antioch.

The morning message was provided by Dr. Robert Picirilli, Author and Professor Emeritus of Welch College, in which he presented the deep and various meanings of the interchangeable terms Pastor, Shepherd, Bishop, and Overseer citing multiple references throughout the New Testament. His designated topic was to expound upon the rich fullness of "The Church and the Shepherds."

Thursday Afternoon

Following a break for lunch provided in the fellowship chapel on the campus of New London Church, Welch College, once again opened the session with a time of worship and praise.

Jamie Lane, Pastor of Parkway Church, provided a clear and compelling message on "The Church and the Savior".

Immediately after, Dr. Bruce Barnes, presented an update on the activities of Grace Mission and Grace Outreach. He specifically included a video presentation of the Grace Bible app to be utilized as a tool for revolutionizing the effectiveness of local church evangelism. He also discussed the details of the public launch for these ministries at the upcoming National Convention in Birmingham, Alabama.

Before moving to the final session of the day, there was a brief period of welcome by the Clerk and Host Pastor, Brandon Baber. He also provided the introduction of state officers. Moderator Glen Johnson then commenced with the Appointment of Committees and adjourned for evening worship.

Worship was provided by the New London Church Praise Band, led by Josh Bryars. It was a collection of hymns and choruses steeped in Free Will Baptist tradition. The evening message was then delivered by Dr. Edward Moody, Executive Secretary of the NAFWB. His address was delivered from 1 Corinthians 6 and spoke insight on the topic of "The Church and the Sinner."

Friday, June 17, 2002

Moderator Glenn Johnson, initiated the Friday morning Business Session. He invited Earl Sutton, Pastor of Unity FWB Church, to open in prayer. Following a brief encouragement from the Moderator the session moved to State Reports and additional updates. Those who spoke were as follows:

Motions were made and carried to receive each report as presented.

Immediately following the State Reports, Brent Patrick, took to the podium on behalf of all Free Will Baptists in the State of Virginia to offer heartfelt thanks to Dr. and Mrs. Barnes for their dedicated service and to commemorate their recent 50th wedding anniversary. They were presented with a card and small token of sincere appreciation.

Moderator Glenn Johnson then resumed the meeting by providing names for the Nominating Committee. They include: Mark Crews (Chairman), Marty Puckett, and Paul Collins. A motion was made and approved to accept the names as presented.

Next on the docket was the Election of Officers and the location of the 2023 State meeting. Moderator Glenn Johnson was presented a list of names from Mark Crews, Chairman of the Nominated Committee. In conclusion of the Business Session, Moderator Glenn Johnson opened the floor for nominations for Delegates to the National Convention. Those names put forth were: Gary and Teresa Hill, Paul and Patricia Collins, and any additional nominee in good standing with the State Association and present for the National Convention to be appointed by the discretion of Promotional Director's office. A motion was made and carried to approve the list of assigned Delegates.

An additional motion was made at the request of Dr. Barnes, that Gary Hill serve as proxy to the National General Board for the 2022 convention. This request comes as Dr Barnes' focus and energy will be more rightly served tending to the national launch and promotion of Grace Outreach and the Grace Bible application. The motion was discussed and approved by all.

Following a brief interlude, worship resumed with Jim McComas singing two specials just prior to his message, "The Church and the Saints." He gave a rousing address from Acts 11, seeing the grace of God exemplified in the life of believers.

Moderator Glenn Johnson then presided over a standing vote of appreciation on behalf of the congregation of New London Church for hosting the 84th Annual Meeting of the Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptist.

The Rejoice ensemble concluded the meeting with songs of praise.

A motion to adjourn was made and approved by unanimous consent.

PROMOTIONAL DIRECTOR'S REPORT VIRGINIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS June 16-17, 2022

We are grateful for the continued support of individuals, churches, and associations for the Virginia State Association Promotional Office and Grace Mission, Inc. Your sacrificial gifts make these ministries possible.

During the past year (June 2021-May 2022), I have preached fifty-one services in our churches, including five revivals. I also attended nine association meetings, participated in various Zoom meetings with national Free Will Baptist leaders, and by phone counseled Virginia pastors on personal, church, and associational needs. The miles traveled for the Virginia State Association this year are approximately thirty thousand.

In addition to these, the promotional office continues to serve the ministry areas of the state association, minister through Grace Mission, Inc., advance the GRACE Outreach program, and send out the Weekly Plumbline Newsletter. The Grace Today program is on hold, but only temporarily. The number of weekly views is not strong enough to justify the time needed to produce them. We are considering ways to revamp this ministry for a broader and more helpful broadcast.

Since COVID and as reported earlier, churches are slowly considering renewed outreach efforts. With this trend, we believe that GRACE Outreach (GO) will become more beneficial to pastors in those endeavors. Accordingly, we are preparing to present the GO program at the National Association in Birmingham, AL. This will be the first time, on a national level, that we can showcase the GRACE Outreach approach along with the management software. The booth will be interactive, and we will be able to explain and show how GO can benefit local-church evangelistic efforts.

The development of Grace Mission, Inc. is getting closer to its end goal. Development Phases One, Two, and Three are now complete. Phase Four, Grace Bible, is projected to be finalized in two to three months. Grace Bible is a free online Free Will Baptist and Bible search website. This approach is not copied from but comparable to other extensive online sites such as Bible Hub, Bible Gateway, Blue Letter Bible, and others. We are building a site freer of advertisements, allowing for a clean online experience for Bible search and study. A significant feature of Grace Bible is that it will also be a continuing collection center for Free Will Baptist preaching, teaching, and studies.

For the coming year, along with continuing the same responsibilities and travel schedule, we will focus first on new-church registrations for GRACE Outreach. This is an important effort for Grace Mission and the promotional office. Second, we will work on getting Grace Bible completed, launched, and advertised. Included in that effort will be collecting Free Will Baptist teaching, preaching, audios, and studies linked within the website. As these two areas are completed, we should be ready next year to complete Grace Mission development: Phase Five, utilizing technology in missionary efforts and church planting.

Virginia Mission Board Report June 2022

- Restore Church went self-supporting in Jan 2022. Kevin continued to draw salary for 6
 months to give him time to figure out what he was going to do. He still has his account
 with NAM but as of July 1, he no longer draws a paycheck with NAM.
- Bro. David Osborne in Wytheville is doing OK. The last quarterly report that I received from NAM was that he was averaging 29 on Sunday mornings and had 5 first time guests. They are running in the teens on Sunday nights and mid-week. We will need to get an update from him on his building situation and his plans moving forward. I do have some fears regarding that. He has around \$10,000 in his NAM account. I think he has a pretty decent amount in his building fund but not sure of the amount.
- Bro. Jason Weaver is very steady. The last report showed him averaging 60 on Sunday mornings, and around 20 Sunday nights and mid-week. They had 1 salvation in the last quarter with 10 first time guests. They are trying to accelerate the payoff on their new building. He has about \$19,000 in his NAM account.
- Bro. Chris Davenport is through NAM but his actual sending church is The Donelson Fellowship in Nashville TN. Bro. Chris is doing well and averaged 185 on Sunday mornings this past quarter. They had 5 conversions, 9 baptized and 52 first time guests. He has over \$4,000 in his NAM account. He also has a couple with him through NAM and their names are The Carabajal's.
- We are unsure what Kevin Bass' next step is. He will remain at Restore helping Marc but he does have a desire to help with another church plant as an Executive Pastor/church planter. We are not sure what that is going to look like yet.
- I have been talking to another young man who has interest in church planting but he has
 yet to fill out a church planter application. There are talks of his church sending him out
 as a church planter.
- We need to discuss how the new Virginia Mission values are working with each board member having their roles.



Virginia Association of Free Will Baptists State Meeting

Foster & Residential Programs

Celebrating 82 years of ministry, Family Ministries continues to serve and add value to underrepresented youth in their care. There are 47 children under foster care across the ministry. In Greeneville, TN, 27 boys reside on campus, which includes 8 in the newly added Alcohol and Drug Program. Foster care is now expanding into the Nashville, TN area, providing additional opportunities to grow homes.

Arkansas

Family Ministries is continuing to work with the Arkansas Department of Child & Family Services for a better licensing agreement for expanding foster programs. FWBFM is working on therapeutic opportunities at all three facilities with the help of DCFS. The Florence Crittenton Home is currently ministered to 9 children; Maggie House has a census of 15; and Young's Home has 20 in foster care and 9 in emergency sheltering.

The Hope Center

The Hope Center held its annual fundraising banquet in November, and the event raised nearly \$80,000. The new administrator, Pam Crank, is doing a great job in developing the operations of the crisis pregnancy center and working well in the local community to move this ministry forward. A grand opening and ribbon cutting ceremony for the facility was held on February 24.

Family Ministries Retirement & Assisted Living (Formerly the John M. Reed Center)

Because of profitability inefficiencies, this facility has officially been closed and is no longer accepting residents. All previous residents were transitioned to other facilities, and all staff members were aided in finding new employment. Family Ministries' administration is in the process of selling the property.

Governor's Bend Retirement & Assisted Living

Governor's Bend benefited from the closure of the Family Ministries Retirement & Assisted Living Center with the addition of 6 new residents. They have a current census of 62 being ministered to in Erwin, TN.

The Laurels Retirement & Assisted Living

Located in the heart of the Appalachian Mountains in Norton, VA, The Laurels continues to provide excellent care to 46 individuals in their 45-room retirement and assisted living facility with spaciously designed private suites, elegantly appointed common areas, and desirable amenities.

The Oaks

The Oaks campground continues to transition under the leadership of a new director. The upcoming summer schedule of events and activities is strong to provide many exciting experiences for campers.

Financial & Spiritual Development

Three years ago, Family Ministries faced a significant financial loss to its overall ministry operations. Since that time, a remarkable turnaround has taken place, and the 2021 fiscal year ended with an overall profit! This change has also been accompanied by an increased sense of spiritual renewal and excitement across the entire ministry. Last year, over 120 salvations decisions were made, and as one long-time staff member commented, "This is the best I've ever seen things at Family Ministries!"

When God Intervenes

TOTAL GIVING for missions and various ministries was \$425,471.20.

VIRGINIA women gave \$5,237.90. We are so grateful for their faithful support for many years. We are also grateful for the support of the pastors and church leadership for the women's ministries in our Virginia churches.

Scholarship Programs allow us to invest in the next generation of FWB leaders. These scholarships require annual support. Our 2021 recipients were:

Available resources provide opportunities for our women to be engaged at home and abroad. *Treasure* magazine is online and free. Downloadable, printable Bible studies are available for each month. International translations are offered in Spanish, French, and Portuguese.

WNAC app offers another means of communication and easy giving opportunities.

WNAC's website informs FWB women of the various opportunities for involvement.

Eblasts highlight current news several times a month. **Videos** will share challenging and encouraging devotional thoughts, as well as ministry ideas.

FWB Women's Ministry can be found on **social media platforms**. Follow us on Facebook, Instagram and Twitter.

Shine's ministry to tweens/teens also has a website and social media presence. Blogs are posted twice each month.

Flourish Ladies' Day events were rescheduled due to covid. The first one held in Huntington, WV met March 26th. Kentucky, Ohio and West Virginia ladies joined to host this exciting event.

The **Provision Closet** offers a tangible way to "love on" our missionaries/church planters. Current needs are posted on WNAC's website though these are often the same. (\$20,976.99/2022)

The Giving Tree is our newest avenue available to support the national office and expand women's ministry opportunities. Women who give \$10 per month have white leaves. \$25 monthly will have bronze, \$50 will have silver, and \$100 will have gold. Throughout our history, we have faithfully supported missions and ministry causes but not taken care of ourselves. The national office is like the pruned tree that needs attention. Will you pray and see what God would have you do? See the ONE Magazine article in the December 2021/January 2022 article for a fuller explanation.



Wow! If you need patience, be a church planter. Honestly, I would rather not be anything else. It has been a slow go, but things are progressing. I keep reminding myself that God's timing is perfect.

Since our last newsletter, the existing issue with VDOT has finally come to a close after a 16 month process. Praise the Lord! That brings us to the next priority of completing the building plans and site plan. We are nearing finalizing each. People and churches have continued to give toward the building fund, so much so that we cannot list them all to give thanks but the Lord knows who they are.

As many churches have experienced, Covid has taken its toll on our congregation. We've not had anyone pass away from our immediate church family yet many indirectly have. With that said, along with media, anxiety had been hovering for many weeks. So, with much fasting and prayer plus a revival service with Dr. Wayne Johnson, the power and presence of the Lord has done some spiritual cleansing and renewal. Praise the Lord, He is moving within our people! Pray that it will continue. Pray that many souls will be saved!

PRAYERS NEEDED

This is my first church building process. As it begins, I have a mixture of emotions. I am super excited to get it built. Yet, there is a proper fear about how to accomplish the project. Building material expenses are out the roof presently so pray that we will use God's money wisely. As soon as the site plan is completed, we will start moving dirt for building preparation and digging for the sewage system. Pray that the building materials will come down by the time we begin construction. If it perhaps does not come down, we will patiently pray for God's timing. If we grow out of our present location, then we will have no other option but to begin building. In all this, I am reminded of Who God is. This building project is nothing for Him to handle. I leave it in His hands. He will make it happen in His timing and, like Dr. Lorenza Stox says, "I believe He will make it happen without a debt." That is our prayer and would like for you to join us.

We will have a general contractor to oversee the project but the majority of the work will be done by the Faith Church family along with many supporters and friends of this mission work. It is hard to come up with set dates for each step of construction

so I have been encouraging folks to join the Facebook group I made called "Faith Mission in Wytheville Supporters." This will be an up to date informational page that keeps people informed of the progress, it lets prayer warriors know how to pray, and allows construction workers know how they can help. There are many things you can help with so I'll give you a list to consider for the future:

- Sewer & water lines will be installed when the dirt will be moved to fit the site plan and building plan.
- · Footers will be poured once the dirt is moved and basement is dug out.
- After footers are approved, a precast wall company will set the basement and we
 will immediately began setting the floor trusts and pour the basement floor.
- Once floor trusts are completed, we will frame the top floor and then do the roofing trusts and roof to put everything "under roof."
- At this point, everything else can be completed at the appropriate times.


