REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD (August 2017)

Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists Minutes of the Combined Board Meeting: August 27, 2016

The Executive Committee met in a called joint session with the Home Mission Board on August 16, 2016 at the Harrisonburg FWB Church, Harrisonburg, VA for the express purpose of discussing the "Grace Mission" project.

Dr. Barnes welcomed everyone and opened the meeting by reading scripture (Romans 10:1-4) and leading in prayer,

A video about Grace Missions was presented and an "Overview of Grace Mission" was reviewed and discussed.

Dr. Barnes was excused from the meeting.

Rev. Marty Puckett presented the Treasurer's report (as sent by Rev. Gary Hill) Account Balances as of Aug 26, 2016:

General: \$9.910.13

Foundation: \$3,024.56 (transferred \$5000 on Aug. 23, 2016) These are the total funds for the state.

Promotion Office: -\$18,570.20

We have not requested any funds from the Northern VA pledge of \$30,000.

However, it will probably be necessary next month.

A motion was made by Rey, Mark Crews of the Executive Board to approve the recommendation by Dr. Barnes which

"Grace Mission will operate as a ministry of the Virginia Free Will Baptist Promotional Director under the approval of the VAFWB Executive Board and the VAFWB Missions Board. Directional oversight of Grace Mission will be provided by the Mission Board including the hiring of new staff to aid the promotional director in the ministries of Grace Mission. If conflicts arise on any issue related to the mission, the promotional director, executive board, or missions board has the right to appeal to a joint meeting of the executive and missions boards. The majority decision of this joint board will remain final as long as it does not violate the original charter of operation concerning Grace Mission. Otherwise, the VAFWB Mission Board prevails in its direction as it relates to the mission work."

The motion was seconded by Dr. Dave Nobles of the Mission Board.

- Dr. Bob Brown, Chair of the Mission Board called for a vote of the Mission Board members. Approved unanimously.
- Dr. Rodger Castle. Moderator of the State Association and Chair of the Executive Committee then called for a vote of the Executive Committee. Approved unanimously.

The Mission Board then pledged \$10,000 for Grace Mission.

Dr. Barnes was asked to rejoin the meeting and was informed of all motions.

REPORT OF THE PROMOTIONAL DIRECTOR 79TH ANNUAL VIRGINIA STATE ASSOCIATION MEETING JUNE 16, 2017

THANK YOU

Let me begin by expressing our sincere appreciation for all the prayers and expressions of concern for Debbie as she went through her cancer treatment. She is doing well, and she is facing a low risk of it returning. We thank the Lord for His goodness in our behalf. Also, I want to thank all of you for your patience with me in that I did not travel quite as much in this last quarter so I could be a little closer to home during Debbie's treatments. I know you understand, and I genuinely appreciate it. I am now back in regular travel mode.

INTRODUCTION OF GRACE MISSION AS A MINISTRY OF THE PROMOTIONAL OFFICE

As most all of you have heard over the past year and as represented in the Executive Board Report, Grace Mission is now a ministry arm of the Virginia promotional office. This is the idea I mentioned to you last year but that we were not yet ready to announce formally. The basic ministry approach was an idea I had pondered for several years, but it became a potential avenue whereby we might be able to maintain a full-time promotional office. Over the past several years we had raised between 62% to 74% of needed funds. It was obvious that we needed an additional funding source. So, the idea was to formalize the work of Grace Mission into a ministry that would meet needs within Free Will Baptists as a whole and far beyond us here in Virginia but also keep me laboring in ministry areas. This approach would also provide the means of raising funds outside Virginia. The raised funds that come from outside Virginia could then become a supplement to the salary side of the promotional office if needed. Otherwise, all Grace Mission funding would exist to operate the mission and its advancement.

Let me share the following for understanding. There is a VAFWB Promotional Office account for which funds are raised within Virginia so that this office can operate. From these funds, my salary is paid and the expense budget for the office, all of which are approved by this body. There is now a separate Grace Mission account with its own incorporation and EIN tax number into which funds raised outside of Virginia are deposited, and I fully give account for all these funds before the VAFWB Mission Board. Therefore, the only funds from Grace Mission that come to the promotional office are the amounts needed to maintain my salary as set by the state association for the promotional director.

This is an understandable approach to funding which first places responsibility on us for the support of our promotional office. But also, it reassures donors outside Virginia that they are supporting the work of Grace Mission and not just building up what's going on in Virginia. It is understandable that some support funds from Grace Mission might be needed to help supplement the salary of the person leading and completing the mission work. Here in our state, we need to remember that the stronger we support the promotional office, the more quickly the work of Grace Mission will advance. The fewer funds we have to pull over to supplement the promotional director's salary, the more funds we will have to expand the outreach of the mission. And of course, all our churches in Virginia will be the first to benefit from that advancement along with our NAFWB missionaries.

PRESENT FINANCIAL INFORMATION

You will note from the state treasurer's report that the office expenditures were below budget by a few hundred dollars. One of the main reasons we had some relief here is because of Grace Mission. Some of the expenses incurred during the year were related to the work of the mission; consequently, the mission account was used instead of the promotional office account. As you can see from all income sources (see the

Table below), a little over 91% of needed funds for the expenditures came in this past fiscal year. However, clarification is needed because it looks a little better than it is as it concerns consistent revenue for the future. Percentage wise, here is the approximate breakdown of income revenue for the 2016-2017 fiscal year.

FUTURE FINANCIAL PROJECTIONS

Within the funds from associations indicated above, a gracious gift of \$20,000.00 was provided by the Northern Virginia Conference. Even so, this amount was to help us continue the office unimpeded through this fiscal year, but this large gift cannot be expected year after year. We are certainly grateful to all donors, and we give a special thank you to the Northern Conference for their help. But what of next year? I project that Grace Mission will be able to contribute between \$18,000.00 to \$20,000.00 during the 2017-2018 fiscal year to help supplement the salary line of the promotional office budget. Consequently, we truly need to see a 10% increase in support from associations, churches, and individuals so the office can operate in the black.

GRACE MISSION REPORT 79TH ANNUAL VIRGINIA STATE ASSOCIATION MEETING JUNE 16, 2017

I encourage you to get one of our prayer cards, go online, and see everything that is involved in the mission. It would simply take too much time to detail it here. However, we are nearing completion of our Phase 1 Mission Development Plan which means that our video production studio will be complete and ready for filming on Wednesday next week. Our target date for our debut of weekly preaching and teaching feeds is September 1st. This gives us the time needed to streamline our production process. Once that is up and running weekly, we will enter Phase 2 which is completing the online version of GRACE Outreach.

I have been holding a number of GRACE Outreach Revivals in Virginia, Michigan, and North Carolina. Also, about twenty churches are now using the program and seeing great and encouraging results. As the online version begins to be made available, I believe we will see a steady increase in participation as well as funding support from churches accessing the program.

I want to give special thanks to individuals and departments of our National Association for their encouragement of and support for Grace Mission. I visited and spoke with almost all of our national leaders, and I appreciate their warm reception and encouragement. I want our brethren here in Virginia to know about the cooperation we are realizing from our National departments and leaders. Let me share some specifics.

DR, DAVID CROWE AND FWB NORTH AMERICAN MINISTRIES

Dr. Crowe was immediately supportive of the vision of this ministry, and both he and the NAM board began significant monthly, financial support of the mission beginning this past January. Dr. Crowe has also offered us a great opportunity to showcase Grace Mission and GRACE Outreach at the Pigeon Forge Power Conference next year where he has asked me in two sessions to share these works with the attendees. He is also giving me the opportunity after the Sunday evening service at the National to be present with their missionaries so we can register them to receive the various services of Grace Mission.

RON HUNTER AND RANDALL HOUSE PUBLICATIONS

Mr. Hunter has graciously worked out an avenue by which we will be able to distribute our video teaching of the D6 curriculum. These lessons will be available weekly only through Grace Mission and only to supporting ministries and NAFWB missionaries who are confirmed customers receiving the Randall House D6 curriculum. This approach is necessary because of the intellectual rights of the publisher for the materials they labor to produce. I am excited to work with Mr. Hunter and Randall House Publications in encouraging the use of our denominational materials.

DAVID BROWN AND THE FWB FOUNDATION

Mr. Brown was one of the first our national department leaders to know about the possibilities of Grace Mission, and he was an encourager from the very start. Mr. Brown and the FWB Foundation recently provided Grace Mission with a \$10,000.00 grant which was specifically for helping us get a major piece of equipment needed for the video-production studio. The aid they have provided will help our production appear so much more professional from the start.

In conclusion, I want to thank our boards here in Virginia who have a vision not only for what needs to take place here but also around the world. The VAFWB Mission Board graciously provided the seed monies to begin the process of implementing Grace Mission. Because of this help, we have been able to get down the road much faster than expected. Also, the VAFWB Executive Board stepped out in faith to believe in a vision I had for the future of the promotional office as well as for our denomination and for a world in need of a Savior! Of all promotional directors of all states, I cannot help but feel myself the most blessed. I pledge, once again, my all for our Lord and for you, my brethren.

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptist Churches and Local Associations of the State of Virginia, being saved by grace through faith in the blood of Jesus Christ, submitting to the total authority of the Bible as God's Word, and realizing the necessity of a bond of fellowship among us, do, therefore, adopt this Constitution to the glory and honor of God and for the advancement of His Kingdom on earth.

ARTICLE I. Name, Purpose, and Affiliation

Section A. This association shall be known as the Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

Section B. This association is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Revenue Law). Such purposes include, but are not limited to the establishment and maintenance of religious worship, and the building, maintenance and operation or churches, schools, chapel, radio stations, television stations, rescue missions, print shops, day-care centers, camps, and nursing homes.

Section C. This association shall voluntarily affiliate with the National Association of Free Will Baptists according to the provisions in its treatise and shall support all phases of the denomination's work as much as possible. This being a voluntary affiliation, this association submits to no veto or dictatorial power, and this affiliation can be discontinued at any time.

Section D. This association may correspond by letter or otherwise with other Bible believing bodies.

ARTICLE II. Statement of Faith

Section A. The Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists has adopted A Treatise of Faith and Practices of the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

Section B. Human Sexuality

- 1. We believe that God has commanded that no intimate sexual activity be engaged in outside of a marriage between a man and a woman. We believe that all forms of homosexuality, lesbianism, bisexuality, bestiality, incest, fornication, adultery, and pornography are sinful perversions of God's gift of sex. Any officer or employee of the association becoming pregnant or causing pregnancy as a result of consensual intercourse, outside of the marriage relationship, shall be terminated from their position. We will not knowingly commission, license, ordain, hire, or countenance any of these lifestyles or practices. Any member association condoning or promoting such practices as stated above will be dismissed from this body (Genesis 2:24; Genesis 19:5,13; Genesis 26:8,9; Leviticus 18:1-30; Romans 1:26-29; 1 Corinthians 5:1; 6:9; 1 Thessalonians 4:1-8; Hebrews 13:4).
- 2. We believe that the only legitimate marriage is the joining of one man and one woman (Genesis 2:24; Romans 7:2; 1 Corinthians 7:10; Ephesians 5:22-23).
- 3. We believe that men and women are spiritually equal in position before God but that God has ordained distinct and separate spiritual functions for men and women in the home and the church. The husband is to be the leader of the home and men are to be the leaders (all ministers and deacons) of the church (Galatians 3:28; Colossians 3:18; 1 Timothy 2:815; 3:4,5,12).

Section C. Authority Of Statement Of Faith

The Statement of Faith as recorded in A Treatise of the Faith and Practices of Free Will Baptists or in this document does not exhaust the extent of our faith. The Bible itself is the sole and final source of all that we believe. We do believe, however, that the foregoing statement of faith and this document accurately represents the teaching of the Bible and, therefore, is binding upon all members.

ARTICLE III. Membership and Representation

Section A. Membership

- 1. The membership of this association shall be composed of properly organized and received Local Associations (yearly or district).
- 2. Any Local Association (yearly or district) desiring membership in this association must accept Free Will Baptist doctrine, practices, and system of church government as outlined in the most recent publication of <u>A Treatise of the Faith and Practices of Free Will Baptists</u> and must be in total agreement with the declarations of this Constitution.
- 3. Any organized Free Will Baptist Local Association (yearly or district) desiring to unite with this association, maintaining gospel order and agreeing with the position stated herein concerning doctrine and church government, and which is in favor of our evangelistic enterprises as stated in the final two paragraphs of our Free Will Baptist Church Covenant, may be received into this Virginia State Association in accordance with the procedure set forth in <u>A Treatise of the Faith and Practices of the Free Will Baptists</u> from the National Association of Free Will Baptists, Part IV, Chapter III, Section V, A3, D, & E. Upon completion of this process, any Local Association may become a member after having been received by majority vote by this association.

Section B. Delegates

- 1. All ordained ministers and deacons who are in good standing with a Local Association belonging to the Virginia State Association, and duly elected officers and members of boards and standing committees shall, upon registration, constitute the standing delegates.
- 2. Each Local Association in good standing with this body shall be entitled to five (5) delegates to be chosen from the laity and two (2) additional delegates for each district meeting (if divided into districts) to be chosen by the respective district meeting.
- Each local church affiliated with a Local Association in good standing shall be allowed one (1) delegate to this body.

Section C. Duties of members

- 1. It shall be the duty of each Local Association belonging to this association to send a letter on the proper form with the required fees to each meeting of this association, reporting in the same its statistics and benevolent work.
- 2. Any Local Association not corresponding by letter and appropriate fees shall not be seated with its delegates until the matter has been resolved to the satisfaction of the body.

Section D. Discipline of a member

- 1. The Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists shall have the right to settle any question of discipline, doctrine, or usage that may properly come before it from any association, district meeting or church composing this association or act upon any appeal that may be made by anybody belonging to this association. Such appeals are to come before the body after having been appealed from the lower body to the next higher body.
- This State Association shall have the authority to withdraw fellowship from any Local Association for practices contrary to the Constitution of this association by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all members present.
- An official attempt by the Executive Board toward restoration of fellowship must be made prior to exclusion of any member association.
- 4. Any charge or accusation against any member association, its churches, or its ministers shall be properly presented in writing to the Executive Board for consideration before being discussed on the floor.

ARTICLE IV. Officers, Boards, and Committees

Section A. Election Procedure

- 1. The Nominating Committee shall select a nominee for each office that is vacant and present the list to the Moderator
- 2. The Moderator shall read the name that is nominated for each office, and declare the floor open for additional nominations.
- Each office shall be filled by a majority vote of the body at the close of each regular session.

Section B. Terms of Office

- 1. The officers of this association shall consist of Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, and all boards and committees as elected by the body.
- 2. All officers and committees shall serve for a term of one (1) year except for the following:
- a) Clerk and Assistant Clerk-four (4) years, to be elected on leap year.
- b) Executive Board-five (5) years staggered.
- c) Mission board-five (5) years staggered.
- d) State Promotional Secretary-If a volunteer, he will be voted in annually. If salaried, he will be employed by the State Association and elected every two (2) years.
- e) The assistant treasurer (Home Missions treasurer)-at the will of the Home Missions Board.

Section C. Duties of officers

1. Moderator:

- It shall be the duty of the moderator to call each session to order for the business and to preside over all business sessions of this State Association.
- He shall appoint a Nomination Committee and a Credentials Committee prior to the beginning of each session, each consisting of at least three (3) members.
- He is to see that all business is conducted according to Robert's Rules of Order Revised (current edition).
- He is to maintain proper Christian order and not allow discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit or when he thinks it will cause discord or division.
- He is to preside over any special called meeting between sessions whether called by himself or the Executive Board.
- f. He shall seat the delegates in a designated section of the assembly room at the beginning of each business session.
- g. He is to promote the work of the Virginia State Association.
- He is to meet with the Executive Board to plan the Bible Conference and the State Association programs.

2. Assistant Moderator:

- It shall be the duty of the Assistant Moderator to assist the Moderator whenever called upon, and assume the chair in the absence of the Moderator.
- He is to meet with the Executive Board to plan the Bible Conference and the State Association programs.

3. Clerk:

- It shall be the duty of the clerk to keep clear, concise, accurate records of all proceedings of this body whether in special session or regular session.
- The clerk shall be responsible for the printing and distribution to the Local Associations of the minutes of each annual session.
- c. The clerk is to compile the letters sent from member Local Associations into the proper form to be sent to the to National Association of Free Will Baptists.
- The clerk is to keep all rulings of this body in order and ready for easy reference.
- e. The clerk is to mail each individual church clerk, pastor, and association clerk a notice of the State Association meeting dates at least one month in advance noting that each local church is allowed one (1) delegate at the State Association meeting. This will include any special or called meetings.
- f. The clerk will meet as part of the Executive Board to plan the Bible Conference and State Meeting programs and will keep records of these meetings, being able to report to the body.

4. Assistant Clerk:

- It shall be the duty of the Assistant Clerk to assist in recording the minutes of the State Association and the keeping of complete records of all business transactions
- It shall be the duty of the Assistant Clerk to assist the Clerk in the printing of the minutes of each Virginia State Association meeting.
- It shall be the responsibility of the Assistant Clerk to fill the Clerk's place should the office be vacant or the Clerk unable to attend.

5. Treasurer:

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive, deposit, and disburse all funds at the discretion of this association. The Treasurer will meet as part of the Executive Board to plan the Bible Conference and State Association programs.

6. Assistant Treasurer

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive, deposit, and disburse all funds at the discretion of this association. The Treasurer will meet as part of the Executive Board to plan the Bible Conference and State Association programs.

7. Promotional Director (2015)

- The State Association can have at its discretion a Promotional Director.
- He will perform his duties under contract of employment at the direction of and in cooperation with the Executive Board.
- The Promotional Director will generally promote the work of the Virginia State Association.
- d. The promotional director shall represent the Virginia State Association, Inc. as the General Board Member of the National Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. Note: This in no means affects the Standing Rule #14 concerning the General Board Member to the National Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.
- The promotional Director shall serve on all State Boards in an advisory role.

8. Board Member for Family Ministries (Greeneville, Tennessee): (2015)

- It shall be the duty of the one elected to serve as a full member of the Family Ministries Official Board.
- He/she shall at all times represent the interests of Virginia in the overall ministry.
- c. He/she shall serve for a period of six (6) years.

9. Board Member for Harvest Child Care Ministries (Duffield, Virginia): (2015)

- a. It shall be the duty of the one elected to serve as a full member of the Harvest Official Board.
- He/she shall at all times represent the interests of Virginia in the overall ministry.
- c. He/she shall serve for a period of six (6) years.

Section D. Boards and Committees

1 Executive Board.

- The Executive Board shall consist of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and five (5) members elected by the association on a five year rotating basis.
- b. This Board shall have the power to act in behalf of and for the State Association form one regular session to another. It shall have the power to elect such officers as may be necessary for its own government, and to carry out the plans and undertakings of the State Association.
- c. This board shall have power to fill vacancies that may occur in any area of the work.
- d. It shall be the duty of this board to make written reports of all its work to the next regular session of the State Association.
- e. This board shall consider whatever business is placed upon it, or referred to it by this association or its membership.
- f. This board shall promote the work of the Virginia State Association.
- g. This board shall plan each Bible Conference and State Association.
- This board shall set the place for the State CTS competition each year when needed.
- The Executive Board will oversee the office of the State Promotional Secretary.
- j. This board shall each year develop a reasonable budget for the work of the State Association and the disbursement of its funds. It shall present this budget to the body in its regular session. It shall have authority to disburse funds as approved in the association budget.
- This board shall provide an audit of the financial records annually and report to the body at regular session.
- All State Boards and Committees shall be accountable to and shall report to the Executive Board at its annual planning meeting. (ref. 2012)

2 State Home Mission Board

- a. The State Home Missions Board shall consist of seven (7) members elected by this association on a five year rotating basis, and shall be responsible for carrying out the desires of this association in establishing and supporting mission churches in needed areas under the direction of the Virginia State Association. It shall report annually to this association.
- b. The treasurer of the Home Mission Board shall come from the membership of the Board. He will serve as the Assistant Treasurer of the State Association and serve at the will of the Home Missions Board.
- This board will have its own Constitution detailing its own responsibilities under the direction and authority of the Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists.
- d. This board shall have authority to make decisions, on location, personnel, and finance. Upon approval of this association or the Executive Board, it shall be authorized to deal with real estate property and mortgages as needed for the advancement of the work of missions.

3 Nominating Committee:

- a. The Nominating Committee shall consist of at least three (3) members.
- The Nominating Committee shall choose a nominee for each vacant office prior to the regular session making written report to the Moderator for report to the body.
- Each nominee should be contacted prior to being presented to the body to be sure that he is willing and able to perform the duties incumbent to the office.
- No one should be nominated who is not in good standing with his church, his Local Association, and this body.

4 Credentials Committee

- a. The Credentials Committee shall consist of at least three (3) members.
- The Credentials Committee is to examine all letters to the State Association and the credentials of the various delegates.
- The committee shall make recommendations to the State Association in session concerning the seating of delegates.

5 Other Committees

Committees as necessary shall be appointed by the chair unless otherwise provided for, and shall hold office until work is completed or until their successors are elected and installed.

ARTICLE V. Meetings

Section A. Time of meetings (2015)

- The Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists shall hold its regular meetings annually.
- The State Association shall meet beginning at 7:00 p.m. on the Thursday before the third (3st) Sunday in June each year, and shall continue in session until its work is completed.
- Special sessions may be called by the Moderator or the Executive Board when conditions demand.
- This State Association will sponsor a Bible Conference on the Thursday of the General Session beginning at 11:00 a.m.

Section B. Procedure of Annual General Session

- 1. Each session will begin with prayer and congregational singing.
- 2. The Clerk shall take charge of the devotional service.
- 3. The Clerk shall then introduce the officers, concluding with the Moderator.
- The Moderator shall declare the session to be in order for business and remind the association of its responsibility to do work for the Lord.
- The quorum consists of those who attend the meeting, provided it is either a stated meeting or one that has been properly called.
- 6. If a quorum is present, he shall then proceed with the business.
- 7. The minutes of the previous sessions will be made available in writing and are to be read only if asked for by a majority vote. The minutes of the present session will be made available to the Moderator at the first possible opportunity. He will assist the Clerk in any needed corrections.
- This body will be governed as stipulated in the most current edition of the Treatise of the Faith and Practices of Free Will Baptists unless otherwise plainly stated in this document.
- The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order Revised (current edition) shall govern
 the body in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not
 inconsistent with this document.

ARTICLE VI. Indemnification

Section A. Actions Subject to Indemnification

The association may indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending, or completed action, suit, or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative, or investigative, including all appeals (other than an action by or in the right of the association) by reason of the fact that the person is or was a moderator, assistant moderator, officer, employee, or agent of the association, against expenses, including attorneys' fees, judgments, fines, and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by him in connection with the action, suit, or proceeding; and if that person acted in good faith and in a manner he reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the best interests of the association and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe his conduct was unlawful. The termination of any action, suit, or proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, conviction, or on a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent, shall not, of itself, create a presumption that the person did not act in good faith and in a manner that he reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the best interests of the association and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had reasonable cause to believe that his or her conduct was unlawful.

Section B. Expenses Subject To Indemnification

To the extent that a moderator, assistant moderator, officer, employee, or agent has been successful on the merits or otherwise in defense of any action, suit, or proceeding referred to in this Article, or in defense of any claim, issue, or matter in that action, suit, or proceeding, he or she may be indemnified against expenses, including attorneys' fees, actually and reasonably incurred by him or her in connection with the action, suit, or proceeding.

Section C. Limitations of Indemnification

Any indemnification made under this Article, may be made by the association only as authorized in the specific case of a determination that indemnification of the moderator, assistant moderator, officer, employee, or agent is proper in the circumstances because he has met the applicable standard of conduct set forth in Section A of this Article. The determination shall be made (a) by a majority *vote* of a quorum consisting of the members of Executive Board who were not and are not parties to, or threatened with, the action, suit, or proceeding; (b) if the described quorum is not obtainable, or if a majority *vote* of a quorum of disinterested *Executive* Board members so directs, by independent legal counsel in a written opinion; or (c) by a majority *vote* of the members of the association.

Section D. Timing of Indemnification

Expenses of each person seeking indemnification under this Article, may be paid by the association as they are incurred, in *advance* of the final disposition of the action, suit, or proceeding, as authorized by the *Executive* Board in the specific case, on receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the moderator, assistant moderator, officer, employee, or agent to repay the amount if it is ultimately determined that he or she is not qualified to be indemnified by the association.

Section E. Extent of Indemnification

The indemnification provided by this Article shall be deemed to be discretionary unless otherwise required as a matter of law or under any agreement or provided by insurance purchased by the association, both as to action of each person seeking indemnification under the Article in his official capacity and as to action in another capacity while holding that office, and may continue as to a person who has ceased to be a moderator, assistant moderator, officer, employee, or agent and may inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors, and administrators of that person.

Section F. Insurance

The association may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a moderator, assistant moderator, officer, employee, or agent of the association against any liability asserted against him and incurred by him in that capacity, or arising out of his status in that capacity, whether or not the association would *have* the power to indemnify him against liability under the provisions of this article. Such insurance will be purchased when deemed necessary by the body.

ARTICLE VII. Tax Exempt Provisions

Section A. Private Inurnment

No part of the net earnings of the association shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, officers, or other private persons, except that the association shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for the services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article I, Section B hereof.

Section B. Political Involvement

No substantial part of the activities of this association shall be the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation. This association shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

Section C. Dissolution

In the *event* of the dissolution of the Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists, any assets of the organization then remaining shall be *conveyed* to such organizations then existent dedicated to similar objectives to those of this organization, selected by the Executive Board at the time of dissolution. This organization must be exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Revenue Law) as amended or under successor provisions of the Code as may be in effect at the time of dissolution.

Section D. Racial Nondiscrimination

This association shall have a racially nondiscriminatory policy and therefore shall not discriminate against members, applicants, students, and others on the basis of race, color, or national or ethnic origin.

Section E. Limitation of Activities

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Constitution the association shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purposes stated in Article I, Section B.

ARTICLE VIII. Designated Contributions

From time to time the association, in the exercise of its religious, educational, and charitable purposes, may establish various funds to accomplish specific goals. Contributors may suggest uses for their contributions but all suggestions shall be deemed advisory rather than mandatory in nature. All contributions made to specific funds or otherwise designated shall remain subject to the exclusive control and discretion of this association. No fiduciary obligation shall be created by any designated contribution for the general furtherance of any private persons.

ARTICLE IX. Binding Arbitration

Section A. Submission to Arbitration

Believing that lawsuits between believers are prohibited by Scripture, all members of this association agree to submit to binding arbitration for the resolution of any matters which cannot otherwise be resolved, and agree to expressly waive any and all rights in law and equity to bringing any civil disagreement before a court of law, except that judgment upon the award rendered by the arbitrator may be entered in any court having jurisdiction thereof.

Section B. Notice of Arbitration

In the event of any dispute, claim, question, or disagreement arising out of or relating to this Constitution or any other associational matter, the parties shall use their best efforts to settle such disputes, claims, questions, or disagreement as befits Christians. To this effect, they shall consult and negotiate with each other in good faith and, recognizing their mutual interests not disgrace the name of Christ, seek to reach a just and equitable solution. If they do not reach such solution within a period of sixty (60) days, then upon notice by either party to the other, disputes, claims, questions, or differences shall be finally settled by arbitration as described in Section 1, above, and such Procedures for Arbitration as are adopted pursuant to the following two sections.

Section C. Limitations on Arbitration Decisions

Should any dispute involve matters of associational discipline, the arbitrators shall be limited to determining whether the procedures for associational discipline as outlined under this Constitution were followed.

Should any dispute involve the removal from office of any association officer, the arbitrators shall be limited to determining whether the procedures set forth in this Constitution were followed

Section D. Arbitration Procedures

The procedures for arbitration shall be as adopted by the Executive Board.

ARTICLE X. Amendments

The Constitution of the Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists may be altered or amended at any regular session by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of members present, providing the change has been submitted in writing and tabled from the previous session.

ARTICLE XI. Standing Rules

- 1. Everything will be done decently and in order. (I Corinthians 14:40)
- 2. The State Association will pay the Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer \$100.00 per year
- The Executive Board shall determine the amount of honorarium that is to be given to speakers.
- 4. Representatives on the National Boards are to be active at the state level.
- 5. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee.
- Anyone desiring to speak shall rise to his feet and address the Moderator by the appellation, "Brother Moderator," but not speak further until recognized by the Moderator.
- No member of this association will be allowed to speak more than ten minutes, nor twice on the same subject without permission of the moderator.
- Reports shall be limited to ten (10) minutes unless ordered by a majority vote of the body.
- 9. The Moderator cannot succeed himself more than two times.
- The State Association will pay the fee for the youth contestants to participate in the National competition.
- 11. The annual State Association meeting will rotate around the state, alternating between east, north, and west as much as practical. Location is to be decided by vote at each preceding session.
- 12. Office vacancies are to be filled from those who attend the State Association meetings regularly.
- Each Local Association (yearly or district) is to send \$200 per member church to this body for National dues, plus an offering to help defray the expenses of the State Meeting and the printing of the minutes. (2012)
- 14. The State's recommendation for the person to serve as its General Board member will be made and sent with the State Association's report to the National Association on the even calendar years.
- 15. To maintain continuity between the Virginia State Association and the National Association of the Free Will Baptists, the King James Version of the Bible shall be the official version of the Virginia State Association, to be used in all meetings, preaching, teaching, and other activities of the Association.
- A certificate of honor suitable for framing will be delivered to the surviving spouse of any deceased minister of the Virginia State Association.
- 17. The Moderator shall be an ex-officio member of all state boards and committees.
- 18. These Standing Rules can be changed by a majority vote at any regular session.

ADOPTION

This Constitution was adopted by a two-thirds majority vote of the members present and voting at a scheduled meeting of the Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists in which a quorum was present.

This Constitution supersedes any previous constitution, rulings, customs, or practices of the Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists.
