- 5. We believe in the autonomy of the local church.
- 6. We believe in believer's baptism by immersion.
- 7. We believe in open communion,
- 8. We believe the ordinance of feet washing.
- 9. We believe in conditional, as opposed to unconditional, election.
- 10. We believe in the practice of total abstinence from beverage alcohol.
- 11. We believe, as a general rule, that spiritual leadership is male.



Report of the Executive Board (3 of 3 pages)

The VAFWB Executive Committee held a conference call on May 4, 2019.

Participants were: Dr. Bruce Barnes; Rev. Marty Puckett; Rev. Gary Hill; Rev. Brent Patrick; Rev. David Sexton; Rev. Jay Baines; Rev. Daniel Cason and Rev. Glen Johnson.

Moderator, David Sexton yielded to Dr. Barnes to moderate the conference call.

First topic of discussion was how to properly present the proposed New Constitution to the body. At issue is a discrepancy in the printed (booklet) versions of the constitution compared to the on-line version (VAFWB.org) and which version controls.

The most recent printed booklet (2017) states that amendments must be "submitted in writing and tabled from the previous session."

The on-line version states that amendments must be "submitted in writing and tabled from the previous annual session." [Emphasis added]

In searching the minute books the Clerk found that a motion was made in 2009 to amend the wording to read "amendments must be submitted in writing and tabled from the previous **annual** session". According to the 2009 minute booklet (page 9) that motion was tabled until 2010 and the 2010 booklet (page 9) states it was approved by the body.

None of the published minute booklets were ever updated to reflect that change.

The Clerk also found a motion in 2013 (pages 4 & 15) to amend the wording to read "...submitted in writing and tabled **for at least one (1) day**". The motion was tabled and there is no record in any of the later booklets to indicate it was removed from the table and voted on.

After much discussion it was agreed that (assuming there is no time limit on how long a motion can remain tabled) the 2013 motion can be removed from the table during the Thursday evening session and presented to the body for a vote. Then (assuming it is approved) we can present the new Constitution on Thursday evening, it can be tabled until Friday and voted on then.

The next topic of discussion was funding for the Promotional Office.

Treasurer, Brent Patrick reported that we were operating "close" on receipts and expenditures. Dr. Barnes reported that development of the Grace Outreach software program was currently on schedule to be released in February 2020 and the remaining financial obligation to complete the software is \$13,000 as budgeted. Dr. Barnes also reported that the FWB Foundation grant he requested for this was not approved so we need to come up with some ideas to raise the remaining funds. Some ideas discussed were: A special appeal form the Promotional Director; potential to borrow from the Northern Conference. Members agreed to pray about this and bring any new ideas to the June Meeting.

Regarding the decision to no longer print minute booklets and post them on-line, the Clerk will send approved minutes to Dr. Barnes for posting on the State web-site and will provide 50 printed copies for the annual meeting in June. (For simplicity the printed reports do not need to include all the report details.)

REPORT OF THE PROMOTIONAL DIRECTOR 81st ANNUAL VIRGINIA STATE ASSOCIATION MEETING JUNE 14, 2019

PROMOTIONAL OFFICE

We have now completed our sixth full-time year of the promotional office, and we are truly grateful for all the prayer and financial support provided for this ministry. The work related to the office is increasing; however, financial funding is not keeping up. The director's salary has been delayed a couple of times during the year because of the shortfall, and we are about one week behind at present. Giving is up slightly from church budgets but down from individual giving. Although not unexpected, this trend reveals the importance of pastors casting a vision on a local level. Of course, church budget support is best because it tends to be more consistent. This factor indicates that one of our most important financial solutions is for more pastors to help secure local support for the promotional office.

For the past six years, we have set this ministry before Virginia, and all areas of our state are aware of the office, its work or needs. Therefore, I am requesting that supporting pastors spearhead local efforts in their associations to help encourage funding. Provided as part of this report, you will see the giving trends logistically across the state and the areas where work is especially needed. Its understandable that this office can become more effective by being enabled to concentrate on its ministry rather than raising support for it. Our other works begun within the promotional office, reported below, are helping us, but these are ministries of outreach rather than opportunities for fund-raising. We cannot expect or depend on these areas for the primary support of the promotional office.

GRACE MISSION

Added to the ministry of Grace Mission in January of this year, the weekly "Grace Today Broadcast" combines various videos of Scripture readings, music, information, and Free Will Baptist preaching. Each broadcast is online at www.gracemission.online or www.vafwb.org and runs throughout the week on phone, tablet, iPad, or computer. Each program is themed and produced fresh each week with a new program coming online late Saturday evenings or very early Sunday mornings.

Phase 2 of development for Grace Mission is the GRACE Outreach (GO) Visitation Management Program Online. GRACE Outreach has already been operating for about five years in churches; however, the online software and app will expand this ministry across many borders. We expect that the app will launch in February 2020. The software code is being written right now, and upon its completion, the Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists will own this unique program of outreach. GRACE Outreach Online may also aid through subscription funding. Additionally, all our NAFWB missionaries will be given free access to all levels of the online program if they serve under one of the Free Will Baptist mission boards. We are also promoting the program at the National this year with a special GRACE Outreach booth along with a working model of the software.

IMMEDIATE NEEDS

The two most pressing needs right now are financial: 1) Strong financial undergirding of the promotional office, 2) Raising of the remaining funds for the GO software. The first is needed so I can concentrate on the ministry at hand. The second is needed because the GO software is in production, and we need the funding to complete the software code by our expected launch date.

It is a great privilege to work along side the church planters in VA. We are proud of all the progress that has been made in each work. This year has been a very productive year for our VA Church Planters. They are reporting very strong first time and returning guest statistics. We have churches that are running out of space. Churches that need to relocate. Churches that are building permanent buildings. All of our missionaries are thinking forward and planning to have strong and healthy churches by reaching the lost and giving direction to those believers to become disciple makers.

Each of our churches are reaching their communities in their unique way. Virginia Church plants must have our attention. I encourage the state, churches and each pastor to pray and financially support each of our four church plants. The state of Virginia has very diverse areas and cultures that are in need of strong FWB Church plants. It is the desire of the Mission Board to be in the position to plant another church in the next few years. Since this is our desire and the cost of planting new churches is so high, the Mission Board has adopted a financial plan that will help funnel as many funds into a new work as possible. The Each One Plant One offering has declined to about \$5000 dollars a year. Each offering will be divided into on of three funds: 40/40/20 40% will go to our current VA Missionary care and encouragement, 40% will go into a fund for our next Church plant and 20% will fund the Mission board and administration cost. This adjustment in our financial position and accountability will help ensure that our works and missionaries are getting the most from our giving. Thank you for the consistent giving from many of you! Let us give sacrificially and see Virginia continue to plant churches in areas that need a strong gospel witness.

The mission board is also organizing and preparing to be a help to our existing churches who are struggling. We are in the process of forming the VAchurch Health initiative. This year we will testing a system of evaluations and coaching that will hopefully give our churches an outlet to talk about their church and snuggles that they are facing. We can be a great encouragement to each other and our own experiences should help each other as we share. Be praying as we step into this needed area of church health and restoration.

At this time our Church planters will come and share some of what God is doing in their Churches and in their families. They will also share ways that you can help or pray for them. Thank you for your support for another year. We are looking forward to what God has in store for Virginia in the year to come.

- 5) This year we celebrated 3 kids' graduations from high school. They all intend to stay with us, for now, while they transition into college or vocational school.
- 6) Currently we have 3 children who are with us because of failed adoptions. One of these has been through two failed adoptions. He left us in February for his most recent adoption attempt, to be returned to Harvest two months later. Harvest was there to welcome him back and this is where he wants to be but the state plans to pursue another adoptive home this is so unfair to the kids.
- 7) We also serve privately placed children (without state involvement). Currently we have privately placed kids from Virginia, North Carolina, and Tennessee. If you know a family that needs help with a troubled child or whose parent / grandparent is physically or financially unable to continue to provide care for the child we want to help.
- 8) Once again, thank you for all you do in support of this ministry. If we can ever help you or families you serve we want to be your partner. On our campus in East Tennessee, the seasons are changing, bidding farewell to spring and welcoming summertime. The mountains that surround us are lush green in color, and it is the perfect setting for young people to venture outside to enjoy our horses on the rolling pastures we are blessed with.

Another change we experienced in mid-2018, we bid a fond farewell to Rev. Frank Woods, who stepped down from his role, and we welcomed Rev. Jim McComas to the team as our new Executive Director. Though leadership is changing, our focus is still to serve and share Christ to hurting children and families.

Other exciting news to share, Family Ministries is commemorating 80 years in ministry this year! From its humble beginnings as an orphanage in 1939, God has allowed our deep heritage of caring for the most vulnerable, to expand to encompass a full circle of services ranging from the protection of unborn babies to providing a safe and secure home to senior citizens. While many things have changed over the past eight decades, our efforts as a ministry are more concentrated today than ever before, as we expressly meet the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of at-risk and uncared for in our society.

Areas of Ministry:

- Almost one hundred children are actively in care through Family Ministries. This number continues to grow, as we maintain our attention on serving the fatherless and motherless in Tennessee and Arkansas through our Independent Living, Residential and Foster Care Programs.
- In the early 2000s, Family Ministries expanded to include another group of often uncared for people. Governor's Bend, The Laurels and John Reed Center, our Assisted Living Communities, have grown over the past twenty years to include almost one hundred individuals in care.
- We also have had the privilege to care for pregnant women who are in helpless situations, including assistance for their newborn babies through the Hope Center, Door of Hope (satellite office) and future growth with Honeysuckle Studios, our Maternity Home, currently in renovations to include 5 apartments for mom and baby.
