The 1999 minutes of the 61st proceedings were read. A motion to receive them as information was approved by vote of "I" with no opposition.

A motion was made to remove from the table the motion from the

Executive Board to modify the By-Laws and expand the Home Missions Board from three members to five. This motion was approved by vote.

The motion was read and discussed. There was a call to question and the motion passd by vote of "I" with no opposition.

Worship Service opened by singing "The Banner of the Cross."

Southeastern Bible College Singers sang "We Shall See Heaven Someday."

Jack Blanton preached from Psalm 60:1-5 on "The Millennial Banner."

A motion to adjourn for lunch was approved by vote of "I" with no opposition. Gary Hill gave dismissal prayer and grace for the noon-time meal.

The afternoon session opened by singing "Amazing Grace."

David Austin gave devotion. Using Revelation 19:1-9 he spoke on the Millennial marriage: Supper of the Lamb

Don Jones presented the Executive Board Report and the following recommendations.

- To increase fees payable to the State from the district Associations from \$35.00 per church to \$50.00 per church. This increase is due to an increase in National fees. (Re: 1999 National Association Yearbook, p. 823)
- That the 63rd Session meet with the Bethel Free Will Baptist Church in Woodbridge, Virginia, (Rev. Dave Nobles, Pastor) June 14 and 15, 2001.
- To strongly suggest 100% participation of Virginia Churches regarding the retirement fund for ministers.

A motion was made to accept the entire report and the recommended items contained therein. After mcuh discussion conerning item 1, (fees increased to \$50.00 per church was believed to be insufficient) the motion to accept the report was withdrawn.

After much more discussion, a motion was made that the Virginia State Association borrow \$2,000.00 from the Home Mission Board

treasury to cover the increase in the National fees for this year. This loan is to be re-paid with funds to be collected from the District Associations, as fees required retroactive to this meeting.

The Executive Board then amended their report so that Item 1 should read, "To increase fees payable to the State from the District Associations from \$35.00 per church to \$75.00 per church. This increase is due to an increase in National fees. (Re:1999 National Association yearbook, p. 823)"

A motion to receive the amended report was seconded and approved by vote of "I" with no opposition.

We do hereby appeal to the Theological Commission of the National Association to examine the teachings of Billy Graham and his Ministry regarding it's ecumenical associations, the nature of eternal punishment as well as the absolute necessity of

Christ for salvation. The findings of this examination are requested to be provided to the Virginia State Association.

There was a call to question and the resolution was accepted by show of hands with no opposition. The Clerk is requested to provide a copy of the resolution to present at the National Meeting.

Sharon Kinder, Doc Hoilman and Brenda Hoilman were elected as delegates to the Naional Association.

A motion was made that Glen Johnson be authorized to appoint other delegates as may be present. This motion was seconded and approved by vote of "I" with no opposition.

CONSTITUTION OF THE VIRGINIA STATE ASSOCIATION (Adopted June 16, 1989)

PREAMBLE

We, the FREE WILL BAPTISTS of the State of Virginia, realizing the importance of a higher degree of cooperation and a greater spirit of unity, do ordain and constitute this Constitution and By-laws for the government of the State Association of Virginia and upon its adoption void any previous rulings, customs, practices or patterns heretofore followed.

ARTICLE I

The name of this association shall be known as the VIRGINIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS.

ARTICLE II PURPOSE

The object or purpose of this organization shall be to unify the efforts of various local associations of this state and adjacent territory to devise and execute measures for the extension of Christ's Kingdom in this world by all of our churches.

ARTICLE III SECTION 1 MEMBERSHIP

This State Association shall be comprised of those Free Will Baptist Yearly (or District) Associations who are in total agreement with the doctrines and system of church government of the Free Will Baptists as stated in the most current <u>Treatise of the Faith and Practices of the Original Free Will Baptists</u>, and who are in agreement with the declarations of this Constitution.

This Virginia State Association shall itself be a member of the National Association of Free Will Baptists and shall support all phases of the denomination's work as much as possible. This membership is voluntary, submits to no veto or dictorial power, and can be discontinued at any time.

SECTION II ADMISSION OF MEMBERS

Any organized Free Will Baptist Yearly (or District) Association desiring to unite with this association, which maintains gospel order and agrees with the position stated herein concerning doctrine and church government, which is in favor of our evangelistic enterprises as stated in the final two paragraphs of our Free Will Baptist church covenant, may be received into this Virginia State Association in accordance with the procedure set forth in the <u>Treatise</u>, Part IV,

SECTION III MEMBERSHIP REPRESENTATION

A. Standing delegates:

- "All ordained ministers and deacons in good standing belonging to the Virginia State Association upon registration become members in full standing and constitute the standing delegation of the Association." (Proposed 1965)
- All duly elected officers and members of standing committees or boards of this association.
- B. Elected delegates; Each association within the state shall be entitled to five (5) representatives to be chosen from the laity of the local association (1981) and two (2) additional delegates for each quarterly meeting to be chosen by the respective quarterly meeting (1989). Also, each local church shall be allowed one (1) delegate (1989) to the state meeting.

ARTICLE IV

DISCIPLINE: The State Association shall have the right to settle any question of discipline, doctrine, or usage that may properly come before it from any association, quarterly meeting or church composing said state association of the Free Will Baptist Church, or act upon any appeal that may be made by any body belonging to said association. Said appeal shall have been written and properly signed by the constituent body or bodies. Such appeals are to come before the state association after having been appealed from the lower body to the next higher body.

ARTICLE V SECTION I

- A. OFFICERS: The officers of the State Association shall consist of a Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, an Assistant Clerk, a Treasurer, and five member Executive Board.
- B. OFFICERS' ELECTIONS: The Moderator shall appoint a Nomination Committee consisting of at least three (3) members at the beginning of each session. They shall select a nominee for each office that is vacant and present the list to the Moderator. The Moderator shall read the name that is nominated for each office, and declare the floor open for additional nominations. Each office shall be filled by a standing vote of the body at the close of each regular session, except the clerk and assistant clerk which shall be for a period

of four (4) years (elected on leap year) or during good behavior, and the executive board which shall be elected according to a five (5) year rotation.

SECTION II

- A. STATE EXECUTIVE SECRETARIES: When needed, the state executive secretaries of department work shall be as follows: foreign missions, home missions, young people's work, Sunday Schools, and education, and shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee and elected by a standing vote of the body at each regular session.
- B. PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY: The State Association can have at its discretion a Promotional Secretary. If a volunteer, he will be voted in annually. If salaried, he will be employed by the State Association and elected every two (2) years and will work under contract with the Executive Board.

ARTICLE VI

- 1. Business Session: This State Association shall hold its regular meetings annually. The time of the meetings shall be at 7:30 P.M. on the Thursday before the third (3rd) Sunday in June each year, and shall continue in session until its work is completed - providing notice shall have been served to the clerk of each association composing the state association said notice to have been given at least one (1) month prior to the time of the meeting stating the time and place of meeting.
- This State Association will sponsor a Bible Conference on the Thursday of the conference meeting beginning at 11:00 a.m.
- Adjourned sessions may be called by the moderator or the Executive Board when conditions demand.

ARTICLE VII

AMENDMENTS: This constitution may be altered or amended at any regular session of this State Association of Free Will Baptists by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of those members present and voting at any regular session; provided specific notice of such intended alteration has been given in writing to the clerk and tabled at the last previous day.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I

BRINGING THE SESSION TO ORDER: Each session will begin with prayer and congregational singing. After the welcome address and response by the clerk, the clerk will introduce the officers

concluding with the Moderator. The Moderator, or in his absence the assistant moderator, will then declare the session to be in order for business. If a quorum is present, he shall then proceed with the business. ("The quorum consists of those who attend the meeting, provided it is either a stated meeting or one that has been properly called." Robert's Rules of Order Revised, 1971.)

ARTICLE II

MEMBERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES: It shall be the duty of each body belonging to this association to send a letter to every annual session of this association, reporting in the same its spiritual condition, benevolent work and its statistics. Any local association which fails to report itself for two successive sessions will be considered dropped from this association. Letters and fees will be accepted from district associations with or without delegates (1965).

ARTICLE III DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION I

- It shall be the duty of the moderator to call each session to order for business and to preside over all business sessions of this State Association.
- He shall appoint a Nominating Committee consisting of at least three (3) members at the beginning of each session as mentioned in Article V. Section 1B of the Constitution.
- He shall appoint a credentials committee at the beginning of each session.
- He is to see that all business is conducted according to <u>Robert's Rules of Order Revised</u> (1915 edition).
- He is to maintain proper Christian order and not allow discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit or when he thinks it will cause discord or division.
- He is to preside over any special called meeting between sessions whether called by himself or the Executive Board.
- He shall seat the delegates in a body in a designated section of the assembly room at the beginning of each business session.
- He is to promote the work of the Virginia State Association. (1977)
- He is to meet with the Executive Board to plan the Bible Conference and State Association programs.

SECTION II ASSISTANT MODERATOR

He will help the moderator perform the duties inherent to that office and in the absence of the moderator will perform all of the duties of the elected moderator.

SECTION III

- It shall be the duty of the clerk to keep clear, concise, accurate records of all proceedings of this body whether in special session or regular session.
- The clerk is to compile the letters sent from member Yearly (or District) Associations so as to be sent to the National Association.
- The clerk is to keep all rulings of this body in order and ready for easy reference.
- The clerk will introduce the officers of this State Association at the beginning of each session.
- The clerk is to mail each individual church clerk, pastor and association clerk a notice of the State meeting dates one month in advance noting that each local church is allowed one (1) delegate at the State Meeting. (1986 & 1987)
- The clerk will meet with the Executive Board to plan the Bible conference and State Meeting programs and will keep records of these meetings.

SECTION IV

The assistant clerk will help the clerk perform the duties inherent to that position and in the absence of the clerk will perform the complete duties of the elected clerk.

SECTION V TREASURER

- The treasurer will receive and accurately record all money received by this State Association.
- The treasurer will pay all dues and expenses of this association.
- The treasurer will meet with the Executive Board to plan the Bible conference and State Association programs.

SECTION VI EXECUTIVE BOARD

 The Executive Board shall have power to act in behalf of and for the state association from one regular session of the association to another, and shall have power to elect such officers as may be necessary for its own government, and to carry out the plans and undertakings of the state association.

This board shall have power to fill vacancies that may occur
in its body, and shall also have power to fill any vacancies that
occur in any department of work. It shall be the duty of this
board to make written reports of all its work to the next regular
session of the State Association.

This board shall consider whatever business placed upon it, or referred to it by this association or its membership.

 This board shall promote the work of the Virginia State Association. (1977)

This board will plan each Bible Conference and State Association meeting (1986) along with the Moderator and Clerk.

This board will set the place for the State CTS competition each year (1988).

7. The Executive Board will oversee the office of the State Promotional Secretary.

ARTICLE IV DUTIES OF EXECUTIVE AND PROMOTIONAL SECRETARIES

The Promotional Secretary will generally promote the work of the Virginia State Association according to the direction of the Executive Board.

ARTICLE V CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE

The credentials committee will examine all letters to the State Association and the credentials of the various delegates. The committee shall make recommendations to the Association concerning the seating of delegates.

ARTICLE VI

Denominational Enterprises: It shall be the right and purpose of this state association to establish and maintain home missions, publishing houses, orphanages, aged ministers' homes, and summer camps for young people.

ARTICLE VII STATE HOME MISSION BOARD

 This State Home Mission Board shall be comprised of five (5) members elected on a rotating basis yearly. (2000)

2. The treasurer of the Home Mission Board will be a member of

the Board.

- 3. This board will promote home mission work in this state.
- This board will have its own constitution and By-laws detailing its own responsibilities under the direction and authority of this Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE VIII

Committees as necessary shall be appointed by the chair unless otherwise provided for, and shall hold office until work is completed or until their successors are elected and installed.

ARTICLE IX RULES OF ORDER

- 1. Everything will be done in decency and in order. (I Cor. 14:40)
- This body will be governed as stipulated in the most current <u>Treatise of the Free Will Baptists</u> unless otherwise plainly stated in this Constitution and Bv-Laws.
- The rules contained in <u>Robert's Rules of Order Revised</u> (1915
 edition) shall govern the society in all cases to which they are
 applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the Bylaws or the special rules of order of this society.
- The moderator's rulings will stand unless challenged, seconded and passed by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote.
- This association shall sit with open doors except when it shall go into a committee as a whole.
- Any person not a member of this association may be allowed to take part in its discussions by obtaining permission of the moderator.
- It shall be the duty of all members of this association to be present at the time appointed for each meeting and anyone wishing to retire shall first obtain leave of the moderator.
- No member shall absent himself from the association during its meeting without first obtaining permission from the moderator.
- No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee, provided the person nominated be elected.
- Anyone desiring to speak shall rise to his feet and address the moderator by the appellation, "Brother Moderator," but shall not speak further until recognized by the moderator.
- 11. The "yeas" and "nays" may be taken on any question by request of one-fifth of the members present.
- No member of this association will be allowed to speak more than ten minutes nor twice on the same subject without permission of the moderator.

ARTICLE X AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws may be altered or amended by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of those present and voting at any regular session providing notice of such intended alteration has been given in writing to the clerk and tabled at the last previous day.

STANDING RULES

- The Association will pay the Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer \$50.00 per year. (1989)
- Representatives on the National Boards are to be active at the state level. (1974)
- The moderator cannot succeed himself more than one year. (1976)
- The State Association will pay the fee for the youth contestants to participate in the National competition. (1976)
- The Association meeting will rotate around the state, alternating between east, central & west as much as practical. Location to be decided by vote at each preceeding session of the state meeting. (1998)
- 6. Office vacancies are to be filled by those who attend the State meetings regularly. (1987)
- Each member Yearly (or District) Association is to send \$75.00 per church in its association to this State Association for National dues, plus an offering to help defray the expenses of this associational meeting and the printing of the minutes. (2000)
- The State's recommendation to the National Association concerning who will serve as a General Board member of the National Association will be made and sent with the state report to the National on the even calendar years.
- 9. Speakers will be given a \$20.00 honorarium.
- These Standing Rules can be changed in any fashion at any regular session by a simple majority vote.
